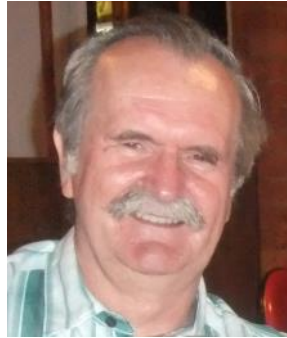

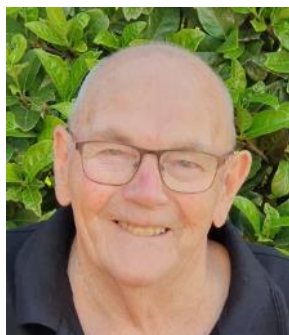

Important information for people attending the Corowa Swim-In in March 2025

Secretary's / Public Relations Report

We need to remind enthusiasts that each year we have a theme but you are always welcome to attend with any ex-military vehicle you own or come along in your modern vehicle to be part of the gathering. By entering the event and being a pre-registered participant you will receive mementoes and a Special Edition newsletter which will give you precise details of everything that is happening including the route cards for the events happening from Wednesday through to Saturday. For insurance reasons we require participants to be entered and pay \$30. Our Certificate of Currency is provided to the Federation Council especially for the parade and other events we hold in Corowa.

Accommodation at Ball Park Caravan Park:

For those requiring a powered or non-powered site at Ball Park Caravan Park it is advisable to contact them ASAP. There are still some powered and unpowered sites available. Please ring and book- no walk-ins. If you are bringing a dog make sure they are park friendly and they must be on a leash at all times as per park rules.

Requirements while in Ball Park:

The caravan park is a council owned property and the local police patrol this area. People are not allowed to drive unregistered vehicles or machinery and must have a correct licence for driving vehicles in these areas.

Local rules for footpaths: Last year people were seen driving on the new footpaths and this was reported to the council. Please do not drive on footpaths.

KVE preparations for the swim-in: March 2025:

Official parade for Saturday 15th March: We have received a grant from the Club Corowa for our parade.

Use of the Showgrounds: KVE have asked for permission to use the Showgrounds from Thursday 13th March until Sunday 16th March. Jan McKenna will be organising the swap meet again.

Entry Form for 2025:

If you haven't returned your Entry Form for 2025 please do so ASAP so it gives the organisers an indication of the numbers and types of vehicles along with the number of participants we are to expect. It only costs \$30 per vehicle to enter and if you preregister by 28th February you will receive a participant pack upon arrival in Corowa. The participant packs will include a brass plaque, hat, Special Edition Swim-in Information book etc. Please look in your Information book for details on the activities from Wednesday to Sunday. The details on the trips are in this book.

Saving a Yeramba, (or two) by John Belfield

The Yeramba was a self-propelled 25 Pounder gun mounted on a WWII Grant tank chassis

The first unit was constructed at the Monegetta Proving and Development Grounds Victoria 1949 and after successful trials the Bendigo Ordnance Factory was awarded an order to build another thirteen units which were completed by 1952.

The M3 A5 Grant was selected as the basis for the Yeramba. The power pack was proven to be a very reliable unit running on 2 GM 6/71 diesel engines.

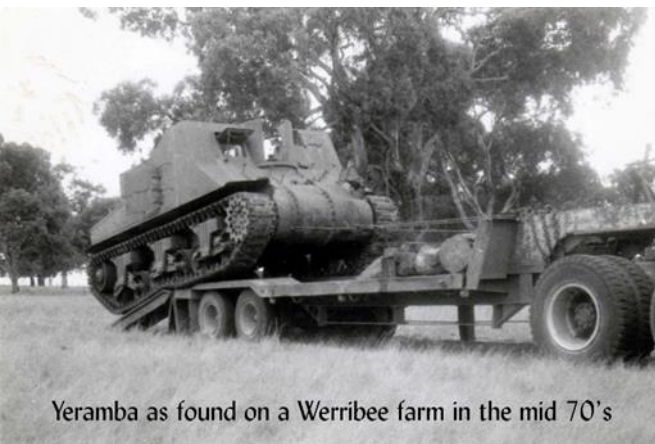
The turret and 75mm side gun and mounting were removed together with frontal armour. A large cross member was mounted just behind the gearbox together with a traverse and elevating section mounted in a new frontal armour.

The driving controls were moved to the right hand front section and new armoured sides added incorporating the original side doors for easier access.

This Australian built Yeramba self-propelled gun proved to be a very reliable and easy to maintain machine together with the Australian built 25 PDR gun which had been proved the best medium field gun during WWII.

Our original Yeramba was found on a farm south of Werribee in the mid 70's. Luckily it was fairly complete with its original 6/71 GM diesels and tracks but missing the 25 Pounder which would have had a late model muzzle brake fitted.

After a fair bit of TLC cleaning and painting and servicing the two wonderful 30 plus year old engines roared into life and we used it for a few years to tow and recover some of our other heavy AFV's in readiness to start the Melbourne Tank Museum.



Yeramba as found on a Werribee farm in the mid 70's

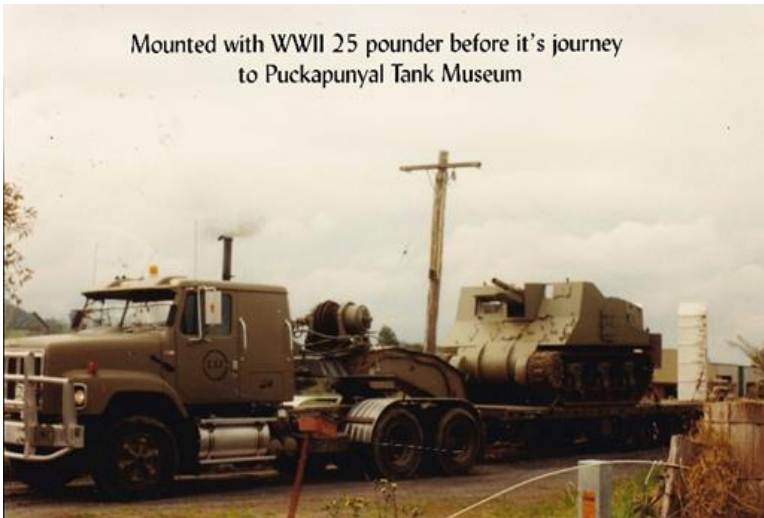
One interesting episode happened when in the middle of winter and the ground was a bit soft we needed to tow a M3 Stuart tank that had no tracks and only roadwheels on one side. So using our old mobile crane to hold up one side of the Stuart (with me driving the crane) and Bill my son driving the Yeramba with 400 plus HP we started to make good progress but then the crane started to get bogged on one side and started to tip over. Of course Bill couldn't see out the back or hear anything over the great roar of 2 GMs flat out so the end result was that I got tipped out of the crane and eventually Bill worked out that something was

wrong! Luckily no damage was done to me or the crane – just lots of mud everywhere.

Later on we mounted a WWII 25 pounder complete with recuperator, elevating and traverse gear and another bit of TLC and painting, and traded it to the Puckapunyal Tank Museum where it would be saved and preserved as part of Australian Military History – I'm very happy with that!

In the mid 90's I found a veritable treasure trove of Military Vehicles at Nagambie in Victoria. It is always a great thrill to come across a collection of abandoned military treasures.

Amongst this huge collection were two M3 Grant tanks in unused condition and a Yeramba Self Propelled artillery piece. All these and many other interesting items had been owned by an earth moving contractor who had been in the process of

cutting up the Yeramba for ripper tines and other steel plate to be used in the earth moving business.

The Yeramba had been parked close to a barb wire fence which effectively saved the left side of the hull from the ravages of the oxy torch. However the whole of the right side was missing together with most of the front armour and most of the rear armour and also the rear floor.

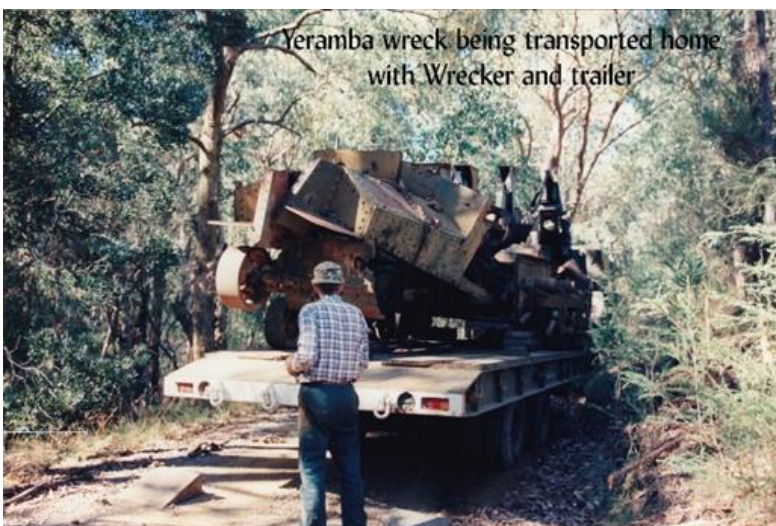
The tracks and also the two 6/71 GM diesels and all their accessories including radiators and engine deck were gone. - yeah a bit of a wreck! Even though the old fellow that owned it had passed away, none of the treasures were for sale and anyway I didn't have a lot of money left over after starting the Melbourne Tank Museum.

So about a year later I was able to obtain the wreck from a fellow tank collector and drag it home behind my trusty M816 Wrecker and Brentwood tilt bed trailer.

It certainly looked a bit of a challenge but it was the sort of job I always enjoyed. Not a computer job, no, just a hands on engineering job. Yeah, I love it, still do, at 92½, but a lot, lot slower now!

So where to start? A third Yeramba wreck was obtained which had been used on the river at Wagga Wagga to extract gravel from the river bed with 2 huge winches and a drag line bucket. This wreck supplied part of the right hand front armour together with a small triangle of armour on the side.

Side armour was a problem but I got lucky. While walking through Plums scrap yard at Benalla amongst some deciduous trees I noticed a couple of familiar looking rungs sticking up ready to trip over. On clearing away the leaves there lo and behold was all of the side armour for the Yeramba! Tony wanted big money for it as he claimed it was tough armour plate 1½” thick suitable for his earth moving customers to make very strong ripper tines. So I paid him his high price but later as a friendly reminder to him after I discovered that the Bendigo Ordnance Factory had only used mild steel on the sides as a bit of a joke to him I sort of suggested a refund! No way Jose!

Front armour was made up with four separate pieces. The side armour from Plums yard had been cut free-hand about a foot from the front corner. Luckily the same oxy cutter must have used the same free-hand method cutting the front side corner and the Plums side armour and the corner piece from No. 3 matched up almost exactly only requiring a thin piece about 1/2” thick to be cut off.

Some of the rear side armour survived but had been cut and discarded. Luckily it was found lying on the ground at the earth moving place. Also the rear floor had to be cut and welded back on.

A suitable 25 PDR with muzzle break was found and bolted back on together with all the ammunition lockers and No 19 radio mountings.

In order to successfully complete the huge welding job, the hull was turned on its side and all butt welds ground off flush and then polished.

Engines next! The 6/71 GM diesel tank engine is not a normal industrial configuration for trucks and buses but modified to suit left hand rotation to run through a three shaft transfer case which converted the drive direction to right hand to suit the standard Grant gearbox and transmission which was right hand to suit the original R975 Continental aircraft engine rotation.



There were a few stories getting around after the war when trucks were scarce and worn out that a couple of truckies tried to put the 6/71 tank engine into a truck. Yes good idea, a fantastic truck or bus engine, but, who needs a truck that has 5 reverse gears and one very slow forward gear. But of course they can be converted at great cost to right hand rotation.

Eventually two good engines were found and coupled up to an overdrive transfer case. The overdrive is necessary as the original radial engine revs a lot higher than the GM's.

All driving controls and instruments were found and fitted. Next lots of cleaning up and a good paint job to hide all the weld jobs. Fit up fuel tanks and jerry cans, top up fuel, new batteries and oh yes! A good set of tracks and road wheels.



Startup was exciting and of course all injectors needed to be bled to get rid of the air. It's always a good idea to keep the top tanks full so that gravity to the injectors stops air leaking in and it should start on the button. Either engine can be started on its own by declutching the other one. There is always one engine starts the easiest so we declutch the slower one, warm up the good one and then ease the clutch into the other one. Yeah it's always a great feeling to hear both roar into life – love it!

This Yeramba was sold to Rob Loudon, owner of the Australian Armour and Artillery Museum in Cairns. I am happy that it is being preserved for all time as another example of Australian engineering coupled with American engineering producing a very worthwhile Armoured Fighting Vehicle way back in 1949.
